## Photoshop Image size


Photoshop's Image Size dialog is the heart of the program. Access it from the Image ▶ Image size... menu.

The dimensions (measured in pixels) are the critical values. You cannot usefully add pixels to an image;

Photoshop can only add averaged value pixels, leading to a blurry image. You may want to decrease the number of pixels, in order to match a desired set of pixel dimensions (for screen use) or to create a smaller file (but this file will

have less detail in it than the original). The Resample checkbox controls whether Photoshop will change the number of pixels, or simple change how many pixels to print in a given area.

Amount of space image uses in RAM memory - not very useful. Saved file may be larger or smaller in file size.



When resample is **on**, you can adjust the print size and resolution independently. When resample is **off**, print size and resample are linked.
